RUŽOMBEROK AND ITS VICINITY

Ružomberok and its surroundings offer a wide range of possibilities for enjoyable leisure activities, as it provides many opportunities for relaxation and entertainment. The town and its area are full of historical and natural attractions.

Tourist-oriented visitors will be impressed by the scenic mountainous surroundings which are suitable for a variety of skilled hikers and climbers. Here are mountains like Nízke Tatry, Veľká Fatra and also Chočské vrchy where people can go for hikes of varying difficulty.

The conservation site Vlkolínec which is registered in the UNESCO world heritage list is the gem of folk architecture. The town is known also for Liptov Museum and the Ľudovít Fulla Gallery, where various cultural events are held throughout the year.

Ružomberok gives an opportunity for numerous sport activities. The Ski and Bike Family Park Malinô Brdo offers excellent services for winter sports fans, tourists and those interested in downhill mountain biking. Attractive thermal pools such as Bešeňová and Lúčky, which operate all year round are just a few kilometres away from Ružomberok.





UNIVERSITY AND FACULTY

The Catholic University in Ružomberok is a public university with a religious character that was founded in 2000 by the Conference of Slovak Bishops and the National Council of the Slovak Republic. In the spirit of Catholic moral, intellectual and academic traditions, the university provides a good quality education and scientific research that aims at the integral development of a human being and the welfare of the whole society.

The Faculty of Arts and Letters has been part of the university since its establishment. It offers attractive study programmes in the field of humanities, historical, social and behavioural sciences.

ENGLISH AND AMERICAN STUDIES

What will I study?

The programme provides students with a basic knowledge concerning the English language, culture and society of Anglophone countries. The subjects cover a basic range of linguistic and literary disciplines together with theories of translation in an appropriate depth with a scope to prepare graduates who will be able to continuously familiarise themselves with the latest scientific research in the field of English linguistics and literary studies. To accomplish this, the programme also includes a wide range of elective subjects.

What will I study?

The student will obtain an overview of the basic philosophical disciplines (ethics, aesthetics, philosophy of law, philosophical anthropology, political philosophy, bioethics, logic, theory of knowledge, metaphysics etc.), whose findings he/she will learn to analyse, classify, evaluate critically and use. The students will also learn how to formulate solutions to diverse problems and how to correctly and persuasively argue in their favour.

What will I study?

PSYCHOLOGY

What will I study?

Moreover, they will also obtain skills and competencies linked to basic psychological practices and methods in all areas of psychological services.

SLOVAK LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE

What will I study?

The study programme consists of two basic parts, which are focused on knowledge of Slovak language and Slovak literature in broader socio-cultural contexts. Students will learn about the patterns of the language structure, contemporary developmental trends and how the language works. In the literary section knowledge from the history of Slovak literature is expanded by knowledge of the theory of literature and the interpretation of a literary text.

What will I study?

The programme provides a theoretical basis for journalistic work in print, radio and television, as well as in press and marketing agencies. Moreover, students will acquire practical skills for author and editorial work in all types of media.




PSYCHOLOGY

Students are encouraged to identify with the duty of a psychologist, who is a representative of a profession that helps people.

The practical part of the course, along with the journalistic practice, is focused on the chosen type of media based on the student's preference.

HISTORY

What will I study?

The study focuses on developing the abilities needed for independent scientific research in the field of historical and related humanity sciences. Students are shown how to solve complex research problems and how to actively and creatively design, process and assess scientific research projects both at home and abroad. They will learn to master all the basic principles and methods of the scientific work of the historical sciences, specialising in Slovak historical research and the interpretation of social phenomena in the past. They will learn how to independently formulate a scientific problem that they can objectively, logically and clearly present on the basis of research in different forms of scientific synthesis. They will also participate in the theoretical development of the scientific field.

SYSTEMATICPHILOSOPHY


What will I study?

The study focuses on developing an ability to monitor, analyse, critically evaluate and scientifically develop new knowledge in the rapidly evolving disciplines of systematic philosophy. Students learn to control the scientific methods of research in philosophy, to monitor the current state of research in this field and to produce and present new results. Moreover, the course leads to understanding specialized literature in both Slovak and foreign languages and to an analysis of the main ideas in professional texts. Argumentation skills, the ability to think critically, to take one's own standpoint and to defend one's own opinions will be enhanced.

THEORY AND HISTORY OF JOURNALISM

What will I study?

The study aims at mastering scientific methods in the research of journalism development and the ability to follow new findings in the rapidly evolving disciplines of the field. Students will acquire the theoretical and methodological basics of scientific work with an application in journalism, the characteristics of the "research – development – practice" sequence and the ability to scientifically formulate a problem. Furthermore, attention is paid to legal and ethical aspects of new media technologies and ethical and social aspects of scientific work. Students will learn how to present the results of their work in a journalistic and social working environment.

FOOD


Meals are served in our own or contracted catering facilities. For a reasonable price students can choose from a very diverse menu of traditional or international cuisine, using their ISIC cards.

For students, teachers and visitors a café with hot and cold drinks and snacks is on the ground floor of the faculty.


